KEY RESULTS

OVERVIEW

European PROGRES provided 530,335 EUR to support 45 projects supporting the Youth and Sport activities.

Almost 35% of funds, or 184,612 Euros, were invested in 22 Youth Entrepreneurship projects, to tackle the issue of unemployment among youth. Another 153,164 Euros were used to support infrastructure – i.e the reconstruction, renovation or construction of Sport Halls in Ivanjica, Knjaževac, Raška and Prijepolje. The Programme also invested 47,930 Euros to support three partnership projects of civil society organisations and local selfgovernments, 79,129 Euros into eight vocational training support projects and 65,500 Euros in eight youth festivals that promote youth engagement, sports and culture.
